THE CIRCUMSTANCES: Ruth 1:1b - ...there was a famine in the land...

Deuteronomy 28:1-2, 12, 15, 22-23

ELIMILECH'S DECISION:

Elimilech decided to relocate his family (Ruth 1:1b-5)

- They left Bethlehem in Judah (1:1; cf. Genesis 12:10-20; 26:6-17; Exoqus 1:8-14).
- They moved to Moab
 (1:1; cf. Genesis 19:30-38; Numbers 22:1-6;

25:1-5; Judges 3:15-30).



ELIMILECH'S DECISION:

Why was Elimilech's decision a poor decision?

- Elimilech failed to respond to the famine the way God instructed His people to respond to a famine (Deut 30:1-3).
- Elimilech failed to consult God before making his decision (James 4:13-15).

NAOM'S DECISION:

Naomi decided to return to God's family (Ruth 1:1b-5).

- Naomi's decision was prompted by her tragic losses in Moab (1:3-5) and word of God's blessings in Canaan (1:6).
- Naomi's return was not easy but it was necessary (1:19-22).

NAOM'S DECISION:

Why was Naomi's decision a good decision?

 Naomi's decision to return home allowed God to write the rest of her story (4:16-17).
